Warren currently is a medical officer in the Aerospace Medical Education Division at the FAA's Civil Aerospace Medical Institute. From June 1997 until January 1, 2012 he was the Manager of the Aerospace Medical Certification Division, which reviews all pilot medical examinations. Upon his retirement, he consulted, worked as an Aviation Medical Examiner, contracted with the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association, and reviewed medical cases for a loss

of pilot medical certificate insurance agency. After five-years, he went back to the FAA to help them out in the education division. Dr. Silberman received his undergraduate degree in Biology at Temple University, in Philadelphia. He went to the College of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery, Des Moines, IA. He took a rotating internship at the Lancaster Osteopathic Hospital in Lancaster, PA and then did a General Internal Medicine Residency at the Community General Osteopathic Hospital in Harrisburg, PA. From there he went into an Internal Medicine Practice in Phoenix, Scottsdale, and Mesa Arizona. While in practice he joined the U.S. Army Reserves in a Combat Support Hospital. He liked the Army so much that he went active in 1985. While in the Army he attended the U.S. Army Flight Surgeon School and then in August 1990 he began the Residency at the United States Air Force School of Aerospace Medicine, Brooks Air Force Base in San Antonio, TX. Upon completing the Aerospace Medicine Residency in 1992, he became the Deputy Commander of Clinical Services at the U.S. Army Aeromedical Center, Ft. Rucker, Alabama. In May 1995 he became the Commander of the Raymond W. Bliss Army Community Hospital Ft. Huachuca, AZ. It was from that position that he was chosen to be the Manager of the FAA's Medical Certification Division in Oklahoma City. While the Manager, he entered the Air National Guard (ANG) and became the Oklahoma State Air Surgeon. He retired from the ANG as a Colonel in 2005.

Dr. Silberman has written many articles and lectured internationally. He just completed a two-year term as President if the Civil Aviation Medical Association. In AsMA he is also the Chair of the Fellows Group.
